# Quick and Easy Christmas Program Idea

## The Angels' Christmas Parade

### **Narrator:**

It's that wonderful time of year when all the heavenly angels celebrate Jesus' birthday. Every year there is a grand parade down the golden avenue.

The angel Gabriel leads and behind him comes every angelic division of heaven.

First, the Heavenly Host choir sings the song that amazed shepherds on the hillside over 2,000 years ago.

*Choir or congregation sings: "Hark, the Herald Angels Sing."*

Next, come the shy Cherubs, carrying their angel dollies and wearing brand new golden slippers. The cherub-keepers try to help them stay on course.



*Choir or class sings: "Oh, Dem Golden Slippers."*
